My Friends in Christ,

All of us have dates that are so etched into our minds that we will never forget where we were and what we doing that day.

*November 22, 1963?* I was in Mr. Sporano's 5<sup>th</sup> grade class at Bradt Elementary School. I felt sick that day and I went home early.

September 11, 2001? It was just about the most beautiful morning ever. I picked my mother at her assisted living facility and took her to a doctor appointment.

December 4, 2005? That afternoon I was at Christ Lutheran Church being ordained into the Office of Holy Ministry and installed as your Associate Pastor.

Isn't that amazing? Ten years have flown by already. And you and I are still here, gathered around God's Word and Sacraments, sinner saved by God's grace through the gift of faith because of Jesus.

I searched through my computer files and found my ordination and installation service. Here is the Epistle reading from 1 Timothy 1:15-17:

I thank all of you for the patience and forgiveness that you have shown me over the past decade. My prayer for you is the same as Bishop David Benke prayed for me a decade ago:

May the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you with everything good for doing His will, and may He work in you what is pleasing to Him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever.
